Each graduate will receive tickets and invitations during the yearbook signing on Wednesday, June 7th. These can be picked up at the sales booth between 2:30 and 4:00. The six tickets that you receive will only be needed for an indoor ceremony (see below). Seating at the outdoor ceremony in the bleachers, as well as some limited seating on the field, will be available on a first-come, first-served basis, beginning at 10:00 a.m. when the gates open. Handicapped seating for the outdoor and indoor ceremony may be reserved by calling Mrs. Eileen Whalen at 508-398-7630.

Decorum

The graduation ceremony is considered a joyous, yet dignified occasion. It will be conducted in a formal manner. Movement by guests during the ceremony is distracting and often blocks the views of others. Please do not leave your seat to take pictures during the ceremony. A professional photographer will take individual photographs of each graduate. In addition, the graduates keep their caps and gowns that will allow for picture taking after the ceremony.

Arrangements for Inclement Weather

In the event of inclement weather, the ceremony will be conducted in the upper gymnasium at the high school beginning at 11:00 a.m. You will be informed of this change by announcements made on local radio stations WQRC, WCOD, and WXTK. In the event of an indoor ceremony, seating will be limited and will require tickets. Four of the six tickets will be designated for seats in the gymnasium where the ceremony will be held. The other two tickets will be for seating in the auditorium, where the ceremony will be viewed via live cable feed. Doors will open at 10:00 a.m. There will be no open seats or standing room available to non-ticket holders.

All senior send-off and graduation activities are school events and all rules and regulations regarding conduct and the use of tobacco products, alcohol or other drugs are strictly enforced. A suspension of several days and exclusion from all senior activities, including graduation ceremonies, may result.

Students attending senior activities may be required to submit to a breath or other tests at any time. Any indication of alcohol or other drugs in the system or refusal to submit to one or both of these tests will result in exclusion from all senior activities, including the graduation ceremony.
