OUR HEADQUARTERS

The N.E.E.D. (National Environmental Education Development) Collaborative operates from a former Coast Guard Station at the seaward end of North Pamet Road in Truro. Our building is within the National Seashore and is leased from the National Park Service. As a result, the building must meet safety and emergency standards required in federal buildings. Both the initial and top floors of the building have dormitory-like sleeping rooms with adjacent separate bathroom facilities on each floor and adjacent rooms for supervisors, (who sleep up or downstairs depending on the numbers of boys and girls in a particular class.) Our middle floor dining area is organized for family-style dining for the group. This same large room is used as a workshop for science project work, arts and crafts. Many indoor and evening activities take place in the front parlor.

Situated a few hundred yards from the Atlantic Ocean, overlooking the head of the Pamet River, adjacent to a small kettle pond and fronted by mature vegetated sand dunes, the area allows staff to direct a wide variety of environmental studies.
