Minutes of a School Committee Meeting

Monday, April 25, 2022

A Dennis-Yarmouth Regional School Committee meeting was held on Monday, April 25, 2022, at the Dennis-Yarmouth Regional High School Library in South Yarmouth, Massachusetts.

Members Present: Joseph Tierney, Vice Chairperson; Jennifer Rose, Secretary; Phillip Morris, Treasurer; Marilyn Bemis; Joe Glynn.

<u>Members Not Present</u>: Jeni Landers, Chairperson; Tomas Tolentino; Grace LePain and Kristen Stagg, Student Representatives to the School Committee.

At 6:33 p.m., Joseph Tierney, Vice-Chairperson, called the meeting to order.

Reports:

<u>DYRSD School Committee Student Representative – Grace LePain and Kristen Stagg</u> The students were not present.

Michelle Dunn - Dennis-Yarmouth Educators Association

<u>Citizen's Petition on Charter Schools</u>: Ms. Dunn reported to the committee that there is a citizen's petition on the Dennis Town Meeting warrant asking the selectmen to petition the legislature to allow school choice to extend to private schools and home schools. She explained that these schools are not held to the same standards as public schools. She is not asking for a vote from the Committee; she is asking that a stance be made on behalf of the schools at the Dennis Town Meeting.

<u>Fair Share Amendment</u>: Michelle Dunn presented a PowerPoint on the Fair Share Amendment. The amendment will appear on the November ballot. The amendment would add 4 percentage points to the tax on income above \$1 million. The legislature would spend the money on education and transportation.

A question and answer session followed. Various points were made on the Citizen's Petition. Superintendent Woodbury said that this is a new situation; there is no state oversight for private and home schooling; therefore there is no accountability. Ms. Dunn said she is not looking for a resolution from the committee. She said that a Dennis member of the committee could speak in opposition to the petition from the floor of town meeting.

The committee discussed the Fair Share Amendment. Vice Chair Tierney said that the vote is on the November ballot. On a motion by Marilyn Bemis, seconded by Phil Morris, and carried 4-0 with Mr. Glynn abstaining, it was

VOTED: To adopt the principles of the Fair Share Amendment pending review.

MSBA Statement of Interest for M.E. Small Elementary School 2022

Mr. Flynn gave a brief overview of the SOI. After a brief discussion, on a motion by Jennifer Rose, seconded by Joe Glynn, and passed unanimously 5-0 it was

VOTED: **Resolved:** Having convened in an open meeting on April 25, 2022, prior to the SOI submission closing date, the Dennis-Yarmouth Regional School Committee, in accordance with its charter, by-laws, and ordinances, has voted to authorize the Superintendent to submit to the Massachusetts School Building Authority the Statement of Interest Form dated no later than April 29, 2022 for the Marguerite E. Small Elementary School located at 440 Higgins Crowell Road, West Yarmouth, MA 02673 which describes and explains the following deficiencies and the priority category(s) for which an application may be submitted to the Massachusetts School Building Authority in the future.

Category 5: Replacement, renovation or modernization of school facility systems, such as roofs, windows, boilers, heating and ventilation systems, to increase energy conservation and decrease energy related costs in a school facility. The Marguerite E. Small Elementary School needs significant renovation work in all major systems. The building's exterior components including roofs, doors, windows, and masonry have all been cited as high-priority issues. The 2014 facilities audit and the updated study in February 2020 by Bureau Veritas identified the same issues along with possible structural settlement of the loading dock, interior air quality issues, leaking sanitary and heat piping, and the presence of asbestos containing materials. Additionally, the building lacks fire suppression and has multiple ADA requirement issues.

Category 7: Replacement of or addition to obsolete buildings in order to provide for a full range of programs consistent with state and approved local requirements. Current capacity is reasonable, however classroom layouts and floor plans with a size of about 900 square feet limit the kinds of educational activities that would reflect best practices for the grades and specialized services that must be provided within this school;

and hereby further specifically acknowledges that by submitting this Statement of Interest Form, the Massachusetts School Building Authority in no way guarantees the acceptance or the approval of an application, the awarding of a grant or any other funding commitment from the Massachusetts School Building Authority, or commits the Dennis-Yarmouth Regional School District to filing an application for funding with the Massachusetts School Building Authority.

<u>Dennis-Yarmouth Regional School Committee Resolution in Support of the Fair</u> Share Amendment

Whereas, the best way to help working families and build a stronger economy for us all is to make sure we have quality public schools for our children, affordable public higher education, and a reliable transportation system; and

Whereas, students need a well-rounded education, founded on a rich and varied curriculum includes science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM), world languages, music, art, and athletics; and

Whereas, major investments in public education are needed to help students recover academically, socially, and emotionally from the COVID-19 pandemic; and

Whereas, additional funding is needed to ensure that all schools can maintain and provide desirable class sizes, offer social-emotional supports, and hire additional counselors, nurses, and social workers; and

Whereas, new state revenue is necessary to ensure the promises of the Student Opportunity Act (SOA) are kept and to make public higher education affordable again; and

Whereas, new state revenue is necessary to rebuild crumbling roads and bridges, invest in improved and reliable public transportation, and expand opportunities for healthy walking and bicycling; and

Whereas, our Commonwealth's highest-income residents, who have seen their collective new worth skyrocket in recent years, while working families struggled, have the ability to pay a little more for the investments we all need,

At 6:33 p.m., Joseph Tierney, Chairperson, called the meeting to order.

Reports:

Student Representative Report - Kristen Stagg

Kristin introduced Rose-Anna Joachim, the new Student Representative to the School Committee from the junior class. Kristin reported that fall sports continue as well as marching band. Senior meetings have begun. Rose-Anna reported that 8th grade elections are upcoming; as well as the Pep Rally, Spirit Week, and Homecoming.

Superintendent Report - Carol Woodbury

1. Maria Marasco - Cape & Vineyard Electric Cooperative

Superintendent Woodbury introduced Maria Marasco, Executive Director of Cape & Vineyard Electric Cooperative (CVEC) along with Matthew Tuttelman of CPower Energy Management. Ms. Marasco gave an informative PowerPoint presentation regarding the services that CVEC provides in their partnership with the Dennis-Yarmouth School District. She said that buying power and competitive bids are some of the value added by the partnership. Mr. Tuttelman followed the CVEC presentation and spoke of the benefits of the solar-charged battery. The presentation was followed up by a question and answer session. Chair Tierney asked about the proposed battery. Mr. Tuttelman said it is a lithium ion battery with a fire suppression system. Ms. Marasco added that the Yarmouth Deputy Chief has already approved one of these batteries. Mr. Tierney asked if it is possible during a power outage to switch to diesel first, then to battery power. Ms. Marasco said the battery has a sophisticated software system; she will look into this question. Mr. Tierney and Superintendent Woodbury thanked Ms. Marasco and Mr. Tuttelman for their presentation.

2. MCAS Update

Superintendent Woodbury gave a presentation on the MCAS results. She said that over the course of the next few school committee meetings the principals will report on the MCAS results for their respective schools. Mrs. Woodbury then shared information received during a recent Zoom meeting with the Commissioner of Education. The 2022 school year was the first full MCAS administration for grades 3-8 since 2019. Grade 10 students in 2022 had not taken an MCAS test since 2019 when they were seventh graders. Student absenteeism remains a challenge. These are mixed results; participation varied widely as well as testing environments; recovery will be challenging. This year is a reset for most schools. The Commissioner recommended looking for bright spots in the data. Mr. Tolentino said he is optimistic; Mr. Morris is impressed with all of the staff; Ms. Bemis asked if the Commissioner mentioned the newly established higher proficiency ratings; he did not.

School Building Committee Report – Joseph Tierney

Mr. Tierney said the next Building Committee meeting is scheduled for Thursday, October 6th at the Station Avenue Elementary School. Mr. Flynn added that there had been a recent meeting about the upcoming move into the new building.

School Committee Liaisons to the Boards of Selectmen

<u>Dennis</u>: Ms. Bemis attended a recent Listening Session regarding the future use of the Wixon School. She said that about 80 people attended and several options were discussed such as a community center, affordable housing, and a café for Pickleball.

Equity in Special Education Indicators and Initiatives Status

Mrs. Lopes reported that the recent state audit on equity in special education and initiatives recently took place. It was an all-day audit wherein the auditors accompanied the Assistant Directors of Student Services, Brenda Burke and Kelly Mooney, to each of the schools. The report was included in the packet and the results were excellent.


