On December 16th, the School Committee was notified that an area of the E.H. Baker school roof above a classroom had some type of structural issue. The class was relocated as a standard safety measure. The roof was immediately checked, the town building inspector was notified, and after initially assessing the conditions, it was noted a section of the existing wood framed rafter system was damaged and needs to be repaired or replaced. It was determined there was not an immediate danger; however, we moved forward to make immediate arrangements to repair the roof. The District filed an emergency waiver request with DCAMM (Division of Capital Asset and Maintenance) to enable us to *immediately* select a contractor to begin the necessary work. The vendor, Gale Associates, has been at the school to assess the condition and develop the design plan. Vertex has tested the insulation and glue on the tiles and has found no signs of asbestos so we will not need to do any abatement, which would have delayed the repair. In light of the projected snow accumulation at the time, Facilities Manager Sandy Cashen arranged for additional bracing for the impacted area. The District solicited bids for the repair work and the results are listed below.

I recommend that the School Committee approve Lohr Construction Co. Inc. to provide this structure repair in accordance with our bid specifications due January 13, 2021.

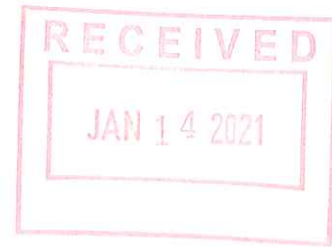

A Dennis-Yarmouth Regional School Committee meeting was held on Monday, January 11, 2021, via remote technology in accordance with the Governor of Massachusetts' March 12, 2020 Order Suspending Certain Provisions of the Open Meeting Law G.L. c. 30A, Section 20.

Members Present: Jeni Landers, Chairperson; Joseph Tierney, Vice Chairperson; Phillip Morris; Joe Glynn; Jennifer Rose; Tracy Post.

At 6:37 p.m., Jeni Landers, Chairperson, called the meeting to order.

Reports

DYRSD School Committee Student Representative – Tainan Nunes: Tainan reported that the students are excited to be back in person at the high school this week. Everyone is cooperating to try to keep COVID cases down by social distancing, hand-washing, and wearing masks. Student Council will be making and distributing cookies to students. Tainan also brought forth a suggestion that the Committee consider having an additional student representative. The idea would be for students in two different grade levels which would bring a different perspective. Chair Landers asked for comments from the Committee. Mr. Morris is in favor of the idea and added that he has been very impressed with all of the student representatives to the Committee. Mr. Tierney asked if both students would attend School Committee meetings; Tainan said that they would both be expected to attend. Joe Glynn is also in favor of the idea and made a motion to add a second student liaison to the School Committee. Phillip Morris seconded the motion and discussion followed. Tracy Post said the item should be listed on the agenda in order to vote. Mr. Glynn withdrew the motion; Mr. Morris withdrew the second. Chair Landers indicated that the item would be on the next School Committee meeting agenda.

Superintendent Report – Carol Woodbury: Mrs. Woodbury began her report with sad news about two colleagues. Jan Murray-Daniels passed away on December 5. Jan was a loyal DY employee since 1992 when she started as a recess monitor, office assistant, and Kindercare provider. Over the years she held many different jobs including teacher assistant, Library Media Specialist Assistant, Technology Secretary, and most recently the Secretary in the Curriculum Office. Jan retired on August 24, 2020. She leaves her husband, son, and three sisters.

Denise Estey passed away on December 27. Denise was a loyal DY employee since 1993. Denise worked in both the M.E. Small and Wixon cafeterias and later became a Special Ed Assistant at Wixon. She joined the high school staff in 2013 and was currently working there as a Special Ed Assistant. Denise is survived by her husband, 3 children (all married), and 4 grandsons. She also leaves a sister and brother. Mrs. Woodbury shared her condolences with the families and friends of Jan and Denise.

A. Student Opportunity Act Plan: The superintendent reported on the Student Opportunity Act Plan. She reminded the Committee that discussions on this began in February just prior to when schools closed because of the pandemic. She reviewed the presentation which had been shared with the Committee ahead of the meeting. The Student Opportunity Act (SOA) is providing a significant infusion of new funds with every district receiving at least some increase in Chapter 70. In an effort to close persistent achievement gaps, all districts are required to submit three-year evidence-based plans to the Commissioner. Most districts, including Dennis-Yarmouth, will have a “short form” plan. The four statutory requirements for district evidence-based plans are evidence based practices; parent/community engagement; resource allocation plan; and outcome metrics. SOA plans will ask districts to do a few things well; and do the right things. Mrs. Woodbury shared the remainder of the presentation and then summarized the Student Opportunity Act initiatives which are Mental Health Supports; Stipends for Academic Support; and Equity and Inclusion Work. The superintendent made particular mention of the \$100,000 for Equity and Inclusion Work; 35% of our students are students of color and should have the same opportunities as other students. At the end of the presentation Chair Landers opened the meeting to public comment.

Public Comment: Muska Yousuf said the program was very exciting. She said that students cannot be what they don't see and perhaps a volunteer program of some sort would be helpful. Also, could people donate books for AP courses; it's a wonderful program and she would love to help. Vida Morris said there was a lot of information to digest. Tristan Williams, Social Studies Department Chair at the high school, said that for students to have access to high level courses that perhaps they could receive stipends instead of having to work after school. Michelle Conover said that long term goals are important, change is needed. Training would have to be thoughtful and realistic.

Chair Landers asked for comments from the Committee. Phillip Morris made a motion to approve the Student Opportunity Act as presented; Joseph Tierney seconded; and discussion followed. Mr. Glynn asked what percentage of the student population was involved. Mr. Morris and Mr. Tierney expressed their support. Chair Landers is in favor of the proposal but added that it might be best to fund programs without repeated costs. Tainan Nunes



agreed with everything being said and felt that the amount of homework in high level courses is a barrier to some students taking those courses. Jennifer Rose suggested that parent awareness of advanced placement courses would be very helpful, especially as a fast approach to college. Tracy Post said the infusion of money is great but how flexible is it. At the conclusion of comments the committee, on a roll call vote 6-0,

- B. 2021 Assessment and Accountability Update: Superintendent Woodbury reviewed the Commissioner's memo which was part of the packet. The competency determination for the Class of 2021 has been modified. Grades 3-8 will have a shortened MCAS testing time. There will be no new underperforming or chronically underperforming districts named this year. The ACCESS testing window has been extended. School districts will have some flexibility scheduling the high school biology MCAS test.

School Committee Liaisons to the Boards of Selectmen:

Dennis: No report.

Yarmouth: Tracy Post reported that 4 interviews for the open Yarmouth school committee position are scheduled for the January 12 select board meeting. Joe Glynn added that there have been several questions about capital budget lists.

Building Committee Report – Joseph Tierney: Mr. Tierney reported that the building committee has not met since the last school committee meeting; bids are still coming in.

Assistant Superintendent Report – Kenneth Jenks:

Initial FY22 Budget Review

Mr. Jenks reviewed the Initial Budget Proposal FY22 PowerPoint that was shared in the packet. He reviewed student enrollment data, selected populations, college plans, key dates, foundation enrollment, Covid-19 update, staffing variables, revenue variables, FY22 Initial Budget, and Initial Budget by DESE Codes. Ms. Post had a question regarding contractual increases; Mr. Jenks will furnish her with that information.

Mr. Jenks briefly spoke about HVAC; staff and students are doing a great job. The guidance is that classrooms should have 5 to 6 exchanges of air per hour.

- A. Election of Treasurer: Chair Landers called for nominations for the position of Treasurer. Mr. Joseph Tierney nominated Mr. Phillip Morris. Mr. Morris accepted and was elected unanimously 6-0 by roll call vote.
