Minutes of a School Committee Meeting Monday, November 16, 2020

A Dennis-Yarmouth Regional School Committee meeting was held on Monday, November 16, 2020, at Mattacheese Middle School, West Yarmouth, Massachusetts. Because of the Governor's order limiting indoor public gatherings to 25 persons the public was invited to participate in the meeting via Zoom technology.

<u>Members Present:</u> Jeni Landers, Chairperson; Joseph Tierney, Vice Chairperson; James Dykeman, Jr., Secretary; Brian Carey, Treasurer; and Phillip Morris.

Members Absent: Brian Sullivan; Joe Glynn.

Others Present: Carol Woodbury, Superintendent of Schools; Kenneth Jenks, Assistant Superintendent for Administrative and Business Services; Tainan Nunes, Student Representative to the School Committee; Eileen Whalen, Recording Secretary to the School Committee; Carole Eichner, Director of Early Learning; Leila Maxwell, Director of STEM; JoAnna Watson, Assistant Director of Digital Learning; Eileen Terwilliger; Margy Marhrdt; Jen Legge; Emily Cross; Joanne Guerrero; Luis Guerrero; Jonah Shea; Tracy Post, Yarmouth Board of Selectmen.

At 6:40 p.m., Jeni Landers, Chairperson, called the meeting to order. The Chair inquired as to whether Mr. Glynn was present via Zoom; there was no reply.

Opening Remarks Addressing Racism

Members of the School Committee

<u>Phillip Morris</u>: Mr. Morris spoke of diversity, being open, and letting others be heard. <u>Joseph Tierney</u>: Mr. Tierney spoke of racial injustice and that we have a long way to go. Face to face conversations are better than one-dimensional social media.

Brian Carey: Mr. Carey spoke of being accountable for what you say even if the First Amendment gives you the right to say it. He found the comments on Facebook very disturbing to him and to many others.

<u>James Dykeman</u>: Mr. Dykeman said he was at a loss for words; these comments have no place in society.

<u>Jeni Landers</u>: Ms. Landers expressed her disappointment that this incident has happened. The school committee does not tolerate racism. She spoke of the Diversity & Inclusion subcommittee. The committee's hands are tied regarding the social media post. Voters do have a voice. She reiterated that racism will not be tolerated.

<u>DYRSD School Committee Student Representative – Tainan Nunes</u>: This is D-Y Spirit Week and students are enjoying it. After school programs are starting.

School Committee Liaisons to the Boards of Selectmen:

<u>Brian Carey, Dennis</u>: Mr. Carey said that today is the deadline for nominations to replace his seat on the School Committee.

<u>Joe Tierney, Yarmouth</u>: The Yarmouth Special Town Meeting is Tuesday, November 17th at Mattacheese Middle School.

<u>Building Committee Report – Joseph Tierney</u>: The next meeting is this Thursday, November 19th at 4:30 p.m. via Zoom technology. The 90% design submission phase will be voted on at this meeting.

<u>Assistant Superintendent Report – Kenneth Jenks</u>: No report.

<u>Superintendent Report – Carol Woodbury</u>: Mrs. Woodbury updated the committee on Covid-19; the staff has done a wonderful job and everyone is working very hard. The boards of health of both towns have been very helpful. She also referenced the email included in the packet from The Law Office of Muska Yousuf.

Phil Morris asked the Chair for permission to speak; he wanted to give credit to all of the election workers who worked so hard on Election Day.

<u>Diversity & Inclusion Committee</u>: Chair Landers spoke about the districts that already have a Diversity & Inclusion Committee. She plans on reaching out. She also plans on reaching out to the local community for their input.

Subject: Sticker Shock Campaign

During the week of November 20, the Yarmouth Substance Awareness Committee will bring together youth and adult volunteers for our fourth annual Sticker Shock Campaign.

Students from Dennis Yarmouth High School will be volunteering to place over 8,000 stickers on customer wine and beer bags provided from all nine liquor stores in Yarmouth.

The stickers have a common message: "Think Twice". The objective is to encourage customers to refrain from purchasing alcohol for minors and reminds them that it is illegal to do so.

Project Sticker Shock is a national campaign aimed at reducing underage drinking by limiting youth access to alcohol. The purpose is for communities to work together to educate adults not to furnish alcohol to minors. Falmouth and Bourne are also participating alongside Yarmouth.




