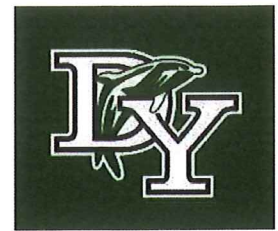
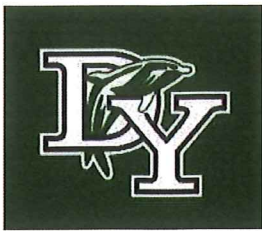

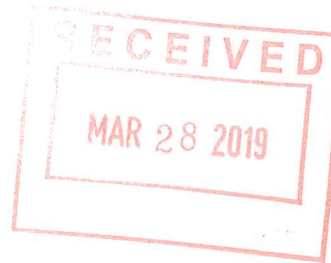

Dear School Committee members,

I am writing to ask that the Dennis-Yarmouth Regional High School accepts a donation from Hot Stove, Inc. in the amount of \$600 to help fund the horticulture program at the high school. I have been working with Val Serijan (PE Department Chair) and Sue Bourque from the Cape Cod Cooperative Extension in developing a community and district wide farm-to-table horticulture and nutrition program. Sue Bourque will be visiting our class 3 times this spring to demonstrate how to use the plants students are growing in the greenhouse to prepare healthy recipes. Students are also growing fruits and vegetables in the greenhouse that will be used in a collaboration planting projects with Ezra Baker Elementary School and provide fresh fruits and vegetables for Wixon Middle School's backpack program. Students from the high school are planning on teaching Ezra Baker elementary school students about gardening. We hope to help them start planting their garden beds by using plants grown from seed at the high school greenhouse. These plants will be cared for and used by the elementary school students for their farm-to-table harvest dinner event in the autumn. Any additional plants will be used for the Wixon back pack program and/or donated to the Food Pantries as a way to provide fresh produce for people in need in our communities.

We are truly grateful to have companies from the community who recognize the importance of horticulture education, and who support the scientific learning goals of our students and district. Community experiences of this nature enable students to develop a greater understanding of the importance of gardening and eating healthy foods. Our hope is that students participating in real world endeavors that directly benefit their community will become the adult leaders of the future.

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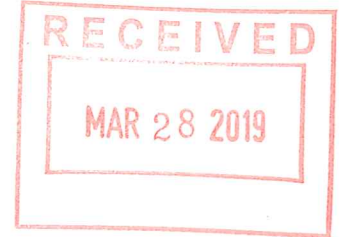

Monday, March 4, 2019

A Dennis-Yarmouth Regional School Committee meeting was held on Monday, March 4, 2019, at the Station Avenue Elementary School in South Yarmouth, Massachusetts.

At 6:30 p.m., Jeni Landers, Chairperson, called the meeting to order.

Open the Meeting and Recognition

Jeni Landers called on Mr. Morrison to present the American Red Cross Hero Honorary Mention to Dennis-Yarmouth Regional High School senior Jack Tierney for his life saving efforts this past summer. Jack will be honored at the American Red Cross Heroes Breakfast on April 5th. Joe Tierney credited Jack's teachers, the Work Based Learning program; and the training that he has received.

Reports

DYRSD School Committee Student Representative – Jack Carder

Jack Carder reported that the basketball and hockey teams had great seasons despite losses in the playoffs. The International Food Festival was fun and educational and the volleyball tournament will take place this week.

School Committee Liaisons to the Boards of Selectmen – B. Carey, Dennis; J. Tierney, Yarmouth

Brian Carey reported that the FY20 budget will be presented to the Dennis Board of Selectmen on March 5th. Joseph Tierney reported that the FY20 budget will be presented to the Yarmouth Board of Selectmen on March 19th.

DYRSD Building Committee Update – Joseph Tierney

Joseph Tierney reports that the Building Committee has not met; they are still in waiting mode.

Regional Agreement Subcommittee Update – Brian Carey

Brian Carey reported that the Regional Agreement Subcommittee has met 3 times thus far; each meeting about 1 ½ hours in length. They are trying to speed up the process; would like to fast track minor issues and resolve the major ones. Jeni Landers prefers that the changes all get done at once; remove the outdated language for instance. Carol Woodbury said that has been accomplished and that the document is now gender-neutral. Discussion followed regarding 5 year rolling average, capital costs, specialized programs, school choice. The school district's attorney has reviewed the document and the language is accurate. Jeni Landers asked about #14, date of amendments, and asked to have the attorney check this. Brian Carey said that the subcommittee is not looking for a vote at this meeting; they are looking for recommendations, dialogue and direction. An extended discussion followed touching on appointment of school committee members, foundation enrollment, operating costs, bond rates, recalling committee members, maintenance of buildings. Carol Woodbury said it

is valuable to be able to plan and predict. Jeni Landers thanked the subcommittee for their continued hard work.

Assistant Superintendent Report – Ken Jenks

FY20 Budget: Ken Jenks presented a PowerPoint on the FY20 Budget including the timeline, key dates, enrollment, revenue projections, and choice/charter. A proposed 2.53% budget was discussed. He said that this is a financially sound option. After a brief discussion, on a motion by James Dykeman, seconded by Andrea St. Germain, and passed 7-0 by roll call vote it was:

A Dennis-Yarmouth Regional School Committee meeting was held on Monday, March 11, 2019, at the Station Avenue Elementary School in South Yarmouth, Massachusetts.

At 6:30 p.m., Jeni Landers, Chairperson, called the meeting to order.

Reports

DYRSD School Committee Student Representative – Jack Carder

Jack Carder spoke about the 7th Grade Open House at the high school and Talent Show successes.

School Committee Liaisons to the Boards of Selectmen – B. Carey, Dennis; J. Tierney, Yarmouth

Brian Carey spoke about the Selectmen's formal budget meeting presentation and that there was an optimistic feeling, no negative comments.

Joseph Tierney mentioned there was no Yarmouth Report and the School Building Committee hadn't met since last reporting.

DYRSD Building Committee Update – Joseph Tierney

No report.

Regional Agreement Subcommittee Update – Brian Carey

Brian Carey said there was a Dennis Selectman packet presentation and that the subcommittee wants to move ahead tonight looking for acceptance.

Jeni Landers looking for the 2 main points: Language changes and then to look at the split.

Brian Carey said the subcommittee worked to take the most agreeable solution. The language is simpler and not just a 50/50 split but a compromise. Compromise on general areas shared by both towns. Joe Tierney said projections on the split seem to hold at the proposed 35/65. Dennis being down by 56 students and Yarmouth being up 35 students.

Brian Sullivan clarified that elementary schools would be the 100% responsibility of the towns they are in and the high school and new middle school would be the 35/65 split. Anything prior to the new agreement would go back to original formula.

Jeni Landers looked for clarification that if there is no new school, then Mattacheese would be Yarmouth's and Wixon would be Dennis' and high school would be split. She said this agreement could pass without the new school. If there is no new school then fixing Mattacheese would be totally Yarmouth's problem.

Brian Sullivan said the subcommittee team was respectful working together. They kept doing what was best for kids and community in the forefront. Although the lawsuit is not helpful, the lawsuit was not pressuring them. In the current agreement, language had not been revised since 1973. Long overdue to revise the current agreement. Doing this for the betterment of kids and to get the healing process started. Jeni Landers asked about the 5 year rolling average and Brian Carey said that is up for discussion. Brian Sullivan said the 5 year rolling average is offering towns more fidelity if towns differ greatly in enrollment. This offers more stability.

Phil Morris said there is a degree of unknown when it comes to budgets. Towns don't know until February what state aid is coming their way. He is in favor of the way the 2020 budget is laid out.

James Dykeman commended the subcommittee on their work and would like to move forward with the new school but has an issue with the percentage. It should be aligned with student numbers.

On a motion by Brian Sullivan, seconded by Phil Morris, and carried 6-1 by roll call vote, it was:

VOTED: To approve the Agreement between the Towns of Dennis and Yarmouth Establishing a Regional School District as amended in Spring 2019.

Assistant Superintendent Report - Ken Jenks

FY20 Budget: Ken Jenks presented the FY020 budget showing demographic trends, foundation enrollment along with maintaining quality to improve and expand. Presentation included 2.53% budget increase. Spoke about the DY Advantage. Discussion followed. Phil Morris shared that our students get far more because we are together as a bigger district than they would otherwise. Joe Tierney agreed that we are better together than we are apart. He is comfortable with the 35/65 split but it is a lot of money for Dennis. Carol Woodbury said it is important at both Town Meetings to have the budget question after the Regional Agreement question. Andrea St. Germain noted that she prefers 34/66 to help Dennis. Thinks the 35/65 is too much money for Dennis. Brian Sullivan and Brian Carey agreed. Brian Carey said he is comfortable with 32/68 with a rolling average to get to 35/65. It is more likely to get a win. Brian Sullivan said that we have to understand that both towns put away 2.5% for costs. The alternative is going to cause an override in Yarmouth. James Dykeman said he can support the foundation budget and that's it. Jeni Landers said 32.68% with an increase of 1% each year over 3 years to get the 35%. James Dykeman asked what if this enrollment situation happens again? Will we get sued again? Will only support foundation budget. Brian Sullivan said that there has been wording placed in the new Regional Agreement that allows for the possibility of an amendment if enrollment fluctuates. Joseph Tierney said that expenditures will be higher to Dennis if we just go with the Foundation budget. Carol Woodbury said the difference is only .6541 if we go with 32%. Brian Carey said he is not comfortable with 1% rolling up every year. He would like to see a one year gap.

On a motion by Joseph Tierney, seconded by Brian Carey, and carried 6-1 by roll call vote, it was:
